1987 CISM JUDO CHAMPIONSHIPS REPORT

Russ Scherer traveled to San Diego, California to participate as a selected referee in the CISM Championships held at the Naval Training Center, June 7 thru June 14th. Competitors represented Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Korea, Netherlands, Senegal, Spain, and the USA. The CISM Championships (World Military Judo Championships) are restricted to the top ten military male judo players in each country. This includes all IJF Weight Divisions. In addition Womens teams may be brought from each country with all females also being active duty military. The competition was of a high caliber, including such well known Judoka as Peter Seisenbacher (1984 Olympic Gold Medallist), Leo White (US National Champion and Olympian), and many European Champions.

The Team Competition was first on the agenda, June 10th, and provided a spirited and exciting beginning to the weeks activities. The USA Team was comprised of Humberto Lopez at 60 Kilo, Craig Agena at 65 Kilo, Richard Moss at 71 Kilo, Earle Smith at 78 Kilo, Owen Blagrove at 86 Kilo, Leo White at 95 Kilo, and Allen Kirgan at 95+ Kilo. The first match of the day was the USA versus Korea. It started on a high note for the USA with an Ippon win for Lopez over Soung Choi. The USA Team then ran into a lot of trouble, losing the next four contests by Ippon - Jang Park over Agena, Jin Hong Kim over Moss, Hyung Cho over Smith, and Jong Woo Lee over Blagrove. The USA finished strong with Leo White winning by Ippon over Seck Ung Kim and Kirgan winning by Koka over Sung Yong Ko. Korea thus won 4 to 3, with 40 points to 23 for the USA.

Korea went on to beat Germany (4 to 3) and France (4 to 3) to win Pool A, thus bringing the USA Team into the Repechage. In the first round of the Repechage Germany

eliminated the USA by a score of 5 to 2. Ippon wins were registered by Agena and White but the rest of the team lost by Ippon except Kirgan who lost by Yuko.

Pool B was won by Italy with wins over Spain (6 to 0) and Austria (4 to 3). In the Repechage finals France beat Germany (6 to 1) in Pool A and Austria beat Spain (4 to 2) in Pool B.

The Finals pitted Korea against Italy. Rennella of Italy gave his team the early lead with a Koka win over H.S. Kim but Park, J.H. Kim and Cho reversed the lead with Ippon. Waza-ari and Waza-ari wins over Cattedra, Sulli and Bertini. Vismara then threw a surprised Lee in a very short time to draw the Italians within one match of a tie. Argentina tied the score at 3 to 3 (with Korea still leading 20-18 in points) by taking a Yuko win over S.Y. Kim. The final match saw Geri of Italy win by Ippon over Ko to give Italy the Gold Medal and Korea the Silver. The final score was 4 to 3 (28 to 20).

After resting on Thursday, individual competition started on Friday and continued on Saturday and Sunday. Friday's competition included Womens divisions other than OPEN and the Men's 86Kg, 95Kg, and 95+Kg divisions.

In the Women's 56Kg division Lee Meinig of the USA beat Beidek of France by Waza-ari and lost to Lee of Korea by Ippon in the Pool, taking 2nd in the pool and advanced into the Repechage Sheets. Meinig advanced to the Finals by beating Janssen of Belgium. In the finals Meinig lost again to Lee of Korea, thus taking the Silver Medal. Lee (Korea) took the Gold while Bronze medals were won by Van Tuvl (Holland) and Janssen (Belgium).

Owen Blagrove was the USA entry in the 86Kg men's division. He lost 3 pool matches by Ippon (the 1st one was against Seisenbacher) and was eliminated

from the competition. Seisenbacher (Austrian 1984 Olympic Gold

Medalist) won a total of 8 matches and the Gold Medal in this 86Kg division.

In the 95Kg division Leo White (USA) advanced from his pool with a loss by Yuko to Claes (Belgium) and an Ippon win over Doukoure (Guinea). White then beat Joly (France), Reiter (Austria) and Den Hoedt (Holland) for the Gold Medal. Chester Evans also represented the USA but lost both of his matches by Ippon being eliminated from his pool.

Marvin Burrows and Allen Kirgan were the USA entries in the 95+Kg division. Burrows lost 3 matches and then beat Martos of Spain by Ippon in his pool while Kirgan lost all three of his pool matches. Neither advanced out of their pool.

Saturday saw most of the lighter divisions compete with Craig Agena representing the USA in the 65Kg division. Agena beat Roehrl (Germany) by Ippon and Verilotte (France) by Ippon and lost to Park (Korea) by decision thus advancing out of his pool. Agena then beat Schulterer (Austria) and lost to Park (Korea). In the repechage Agena beat Ferroni of Italy to win the Bronze Medal.

Richard Moss and Angelo Ruiz were the USA entries in the 71Kg division. Moss beat Devos (Belgium) by Waza-ari and Steenoven (Holland) by Ippon and lost to Sulli (Italy) by Ippon to advance out of his pool. Moss then lost to Kim (Korea) and a loss to Bozo (France) for the Bronze eliminated Moss from the competition. Ruiz won by Waza-ari over Summer (Austria), lost to Rozo (France) by Ippon, and beat Bockhoff (Germany) by Yuko to advance out of his pool. Ruiz then lost to Lee (Korea), dropped into the repechage and lost the Bronze medal match to Sulli (Italy).

In the 78Kg division Earle Smith represented the USA. He lost

to Spvkers (Holland) and Laats (Belgium), both by Ippon, and was eliminated from the competition.

The final day of competition included 60Kg men, and the OPEN divisions for both men and women. Humberto Lopez, the USA entry, had to withdraw due to injury from the 60Kg division. Marvin Burrows (USA) lost 3 matches in his pool and was eliminated from the OPEN division. In the Women's Open Lee Meinig and Julia Hamacher represented the USA. Meinig lost her 3 matches (all against much larger women) in her pool and was eliminated from further competition. Hamacher lost 4 matches in her pool and was eliminated.

San Diego provided a nice setting for this important event. After the official closing ceremonies, an excellent banquet and party was provided for all competitors and officials. The medal winners were as follows:

The Final Trials for the U.S. Team to the World Championships were held at the Olympic Training Center on May 23, 1987. The top point player (as of the 1st trials) bypassed the first trials and played "best 2 out of 3" against the winner of the first trials held several months ago. The winner of this second trials will be the U.S. competitor at the World Championships this year. This is especially important for the women since the top 5 place finishers in the 1987 World Championships will be the only ones eligible to compete in the women's Judo competition at the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, Korea.

The winners of the trials are the U.S. Team and the losers of the trials are the alternates.

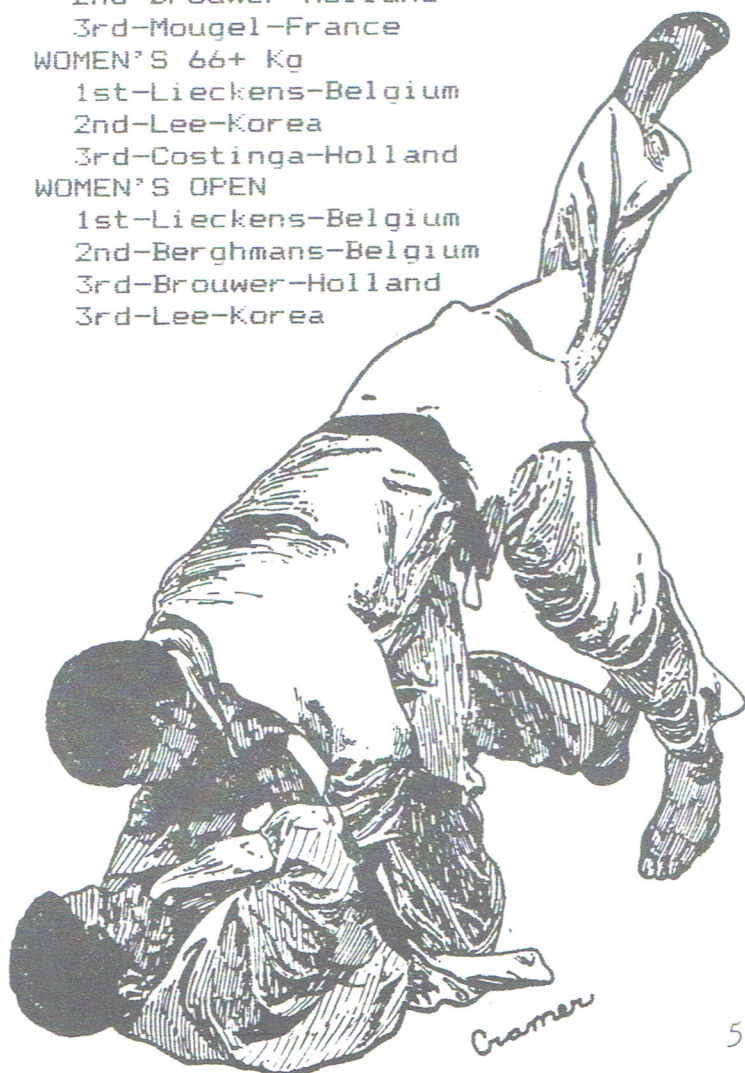

ANNUAL AWARDS GIVEN FOR 1986

The OSJI will present annually special awards to the most outstanding members in several categories. The 1986 Awards were given at the Annual Meeting as follows:

Outstanding Junior Judoka - Desmond Wong
Outstanding Coach - Les Fazekas
Outstanding Official - Russ Scherer
Outstanding Administrator - Joyce Edwards

Toni Barnes, a member of the Shodokan Judo Club, had a super year during 1986 at the National level. Besides being state champion in Ohio, Toni placed 2nd at the 1986 Senior Nationals and 3rd at the 1986 U.S. International Invitational. She was 2nd in the National Point Standings (158 lb division) and won the preliminary trials for the World Team.

Desmond Wong took 2nd Place at the 1986 National Junior Olympics in Colorado Springs as well as capturing the Ohio State Junior Olympics and the Ohio Junior Championships last year. Desmond is a Junior 10th Degree (purple belt) from the Kittyhawk Judo Club.

Les Fazekas coaches the Shodokan Judo Club in Lorain, Ohio and always brings a strong team to state and regional tournaments. Les is the coach of Toni Barnes, Dennis Eldridge, Ann Fazekas, Richard Dittrich and others who have placed in both junior and senior national events.

Russ Scherer is an IJF-B Referee who is very active on the local, state, regional, national, and international scenes. Russ gives referee clinics and frequently serves as Head Referee. He is the coach of the Kittyhawk Judo Club.

Joyce Edwards, a member of the Springfield Judo Club, was selected as outstanding administrator due to her involvement at almost every judo tournament in the Midwest and many National events. She often handles registration, pooling, etc and has introduced computerization on site at many shiais.

The first group of recipients of these awards set the tone for future presentations. They are most deserving and have, each in their own way, brought credit upon the Ohio Judo Program.

OHIO JUDOKA PLACE AT NATIONALS - 1986

Eleven Judoka from Ohio placed at various national events during 1986. Toni Barnes, now residing in Florida, started the collection of medals with a second place finish at the Senior Nationals in Hawaii last April. During 1986 Toni was a member of the Shodokan Judo Club in Elvria, Ohio.

The Olympic Training Center, Colorado Springs, Co. was the site of the 1986 National Junior Olympics and several Ohio players did well at this event. Desmond Wong took the Silver Medal in the Boys Intermediate division. Desmond is a member of the Kittyhawk Judo Club in Englewood. Allister Thorpe placed first in the Juvenile B 209+ division while Robert King took second place in the Juvenile B 143 lb division. Both young men are members of the DAMAC Judo Club. Jerry Gee, a member of the Miami Co. YMCA Judo Club, won the Bronze Medal in the Juvenile B 209+ lb division.

The DAMAC Judo Club traveled on to Las Vegas, Nv. to take part in the 1986 USJA Junior Nationals. And TAKE they did. Marcus Hinton placed 3rd in the boys 7 yr old/over 66 lbs division; Robert King took 3rd in the YM 143 lb division; Roderick Duncan won the Silver Medal in the YM 189 lb division; and Allister Thorpe took the Gold Medal in the YM 209+ lb division. The young women from DAMAC also did well as Carla Montgomery took 3rd in the girls 14 yr old/110 lb division and Sheri Talley placed 3rd in the YW 145 lb division.

At the USJF Junior Nationals (1986) Lorey Edwards of the Shodokan Judo Club won the Gold Medal in the Girls 15 yr old Heavy category. Janet Gray, representing the Hamilton Judo Club, took 2nd Place in the YW 106 lb category.

The year's activities were culminated by Toni Barnes' performance at the 1986 U.S. International Invitational Championships held at the OTC in Colorado Springs. Toni won a Bronze Medal in the 158 lb division.

REFEREE'S CORNER

An EDITORIAL by Russ Scherer (IJF B)

Several topics will be covered in this editorial - some apply only to referees and others apply to coaches and players as well. For those who attend shiais regularly, I am sure you have noticed a dropoff in the number of competitors in most divisions. Have you also noticed the smaller number of referees showing up to help at these events? Several years ago we had a surge of new officials who desired to promote judo through their participation in the sport as an official. A program was developed and clinics were held to train these interested officials. Recently, however, the number of new people becoming involved in refereeing has been extremely limited. Interest in Referee Clinics has dwindled to the point where it is impractical to hold such clinics. Why? Results of past programs have been very successful. At last years Class C Certification at the Collegiate Nationals the only candidate to pass was from Ohio and at the Am-Can Challenge this year the only Referee to be certified had all of his training in Ohio.

As the older officials become less active there are fewer and fewer younger officials to take their places. Some of our formerly "up and coming" referees have turned to full time coaching at shiais, others don't attend at all anymore. I believe we must all encourage participation by new people in all aspects of judo activity.

To foster the development of new competent officials the Officials Program and Referee Certification Program will again be emphasized. However the success of these efforts will be in your hands and will depend directly on your participation.

Midwest Officials Association to be formed

Several National and International Referees from various states in the Midwest have held discussions concerning the formation of a "Midwest Officials Association". This concept has the support of several of the state organizations already and other states are discussing, or are scheduled to discuss, this idea at their state meetings. The membership in this association will be open to all interested officials. The purposes will include training seminars, coordination of officials and a regional approach to officiating problems. Further details will be published as they develop.

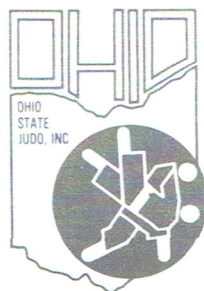
WHO KNOWS HOW TO BOW????

If you have been to a judo tournament lately, it is obvious that the answer to this question is NOT most players. Much tradition is no longer being taught in many Dojos, which I think is a disservice to our young Judoka, but I think it is necessary to at least teach the correct way to bow. The REI is the proper method of greeting others in our sport and it is a formal part of the judo contest. At the Am-Can Judo Challenge this year, a black belt from Canada was surprised when the tournament staff felt it was necessary to review the proper bowing procedure before the start of competition. It was obvious as the day proceeded, however, that not only was it necessary but many players were not paying attention. Recently Referees have been required to teach this basic skill because many Coaches have not been able to teach this aspect of Judo. In general it is not the responsibility of the referee to teach while on the mat, but since it is the referee's task to insure the match is conducted according to the rules, correct bowing must be taught. It would help tremendously if ALL Coaches would spend enough time teaching proper bowing procedures at their club practices so that others would not have to take the time to do so at tournaments.

In case you are not familiar with the correct bow in procedures for tournament matches it is as follows:

- 1) walk around the back side of the judges to a position outside the contest area in line with the marker tapes
- 2) when both players are in place they bow on to the mat at the same time, walk to the starting tapes (red and white), bow to each other, step toward (left then right) and wait for the referee to call HAJIME!
- 3) when the match is over the players line up a half step in front of their tape and when the referee awards the match both players take a step backwards (right then left) and being behind the tape bow at to each other simultaneously. They may then leave the mat and shake hands if they so desire.

*** NOTE - When you bow your oi should be neat. Stand in Shizen hon tai, bring your heels together, arms at your sides touching your thighs. As you bow keep your back straight and bow smoothly until your fingertips touch your knees, the straighten back up. Do not make a fist or allow the hands to move away from the body.
