OJI Hall of Fame Selection Guidelines/Criteria

Selection to the OJI Hall of Fame shall be predicated on outstanding achievement in Judo, normally over a prolonged period of time. Advancing Judo in Ohio through development, implementation and enhancement of programs that increase participation, enhance performance and/or bolster recognition of the benefits of Judo will be important factors when considering potential candidates for Hall of Fame membership.

Examples of positive considerations to support selection to the OJI Hall of Fame:

- Provide training at the club level that results in large numbers of participants in Ohio judo programs
- Provide training at the club level that results in superior competitive capability of its members that leads to shiai success at state, regional, national and/or international levels
- Provide training and/or program enhancements at the state or national level that result in success at higher level events
- Attain outstanding competitive results at national and international events over a prolonged period
- Attain high levels of certification as an official or coach and represent the U.S. at international events over a prolonged period
- Hold positions and develop programs for the advancement of Judo at the national or international level
- Implement programs and activities that enhance judo development and/or popularity at state, regional, national or international levels
- Exceptional long-term support of OJI operations and programs
